## Course Description

AP Psychology is a dual-credit class designed to provide high school and college credit.
Students must pass the AP Exam in the spring with a score of 3-5. Colleges and universities require different scores to receive college credit. Be sure to check which score your college requires.

The AP Psychology course is designed to introduce students to the systematic and scientific study of the behavior and mental processes of human beings and other animals. Students are exposed to the psychological facts, principles, and phenomena associated with each of the major subfields within psychology. They also learn about the ethics and methods psychologists use in their science and practice.

## AP Exam Success

Performing well on an AP Exam means more than just the successful completion of a course; it is a pathway to success in college. Research consistently shows that students who score a 3 or higher on AP Exams typically experience greater academic success in college and are more likely to graduate on time than otherwise comparable non-AP peers.

## Scoring the Exam

An AP Exam score of 5 is equivalent to the average score among college students earning grades of A in the college course. Similarly, AP Exam scores of 4 are equivalent to college grades of $A, B+$, and $B$. AP Exam scores of 3 are equivalent to college grades of $B-, C+$, and $C$.
